00:14:37	Denise: I think Baroque is used because it's what is strongly recommend in Orff levels.
00:14:57	Does Music Play online have Baroque fingering? I have Baroque recorders
00:15:38	I did an Orff level this summer - they were adamant about Baroque Aulos
	recorders, but I think I'm going to use German this year Easier with children to do the German F.

00:15:43	Denise Gagne: I would encourage you to try a German fingering recorder and test the tuning yourself. Tuners are readily available and you'll see that German fingering can be in - tune. Differs from brand to brand.

00:16:30	Denise Gagne: Musicplay Recorder section includes both Baroque and German fingerings. All our publications include both.

	to tune and to get those high notes accurately, but I'm not married to it.

00:21:24	We do Loom bands for Recorder Karate 1, Then we buy the braided cords from
	MusicK8 for Recorder Karate 2.
00:21:26	Velcro ties with embroidery floss
00:21:39	Denise Gagne: Choice beads are such a good idea!
00:21:41	small colored rubber bands, the kind they use to make bracelets, etc.
00:21:48	I bought embroidery string from Michaels. Not too expensive.
00:21:55	My kids tie the yarn/belts on the end of the yellow case zipper. I give them each
	a 'key ring' ring from the dollar store to put on the end of the zipper.
00:21:56	I buy Music K8 O rings and tie the ribbons or beads from a cord.
00:22:00	I have a belt that I tie on for level 1 (Gold belt is O Canada in level 1, level 2 is
	Star Spangled Banner).
00:22:53	I use a 1" metal ring with the colored pony beads. They can clip right on the bell
	of the recorder.
00:22:56	I have kids names on the wall too on each level, and the ones that don't have
	white belt yet, I have a Recorder Padawan sheet.

	classroom?
00:24:13	Denise Gagne: O Canada and Star Spangled Banner are difficult songs for kids. When my kids learned to play O Canada and got their black belt, I'd have them play with me on the piano in an assembly.
00:24:14	Oooo haven't tried that one yet - I'll use it this year.
00:24:33	Denise Gagne: Coconut Chaos is ridiculously fun!
00:24:43	I actually had kids play O Canada over the microphone if they wanted to play it
	for the school (usually in pairs).

00:25:46	Do you have kids play these at home? Or how do you use it as a whole class?
00:25:53	I used Note toss for kids having trouble with the bass clef on piano.
00:26:05	Denise Gagne: Play O Canada over the intercom??? - that would motivate
00:26:16	For Coconut Chaos, the kids played as a class and called out the letter names
00:26:46	I would keep track of the numbers and we would try beat them the next time we
	played.
00:27:01	Yes, the kids who passed gold belt got the opportunity to play it over the intercom and I would have them rehearse together at a recess time.

00:27:56	Hand Staff is awesome. Kids love it
00:28:16	Denise Gagne: Hand Staff is great to use as Exit Tickets
00:28:26	Hand staff is quick and easy even if you have couple minutes left of class time
00:28:32	I use the hand staff too, put my thumb on the bottom so the fingering is the same for piano
00:29:10	Denise Gagne: Lucy Horsch is amazing
00:29:30	Have you seen the guy who does recorder to Fortnight? Kids really love him.
	He's on YouTube.
00:29:45	Is coconut chaos smart board enabled? :-) New smart board this year
00:29:46	Is there a way to search by instrument in the listening kits to find the recorder
	songs?
00:29:55	I don't use Karate. Each class works together to build a recorder chain that is displayed on the board. Kids earn chains by performing an assigned excerpt in class in the style of the game "telephone". It's called Don't Break the Chain. Practice at home to earn a class chain is the motivation for home practice. I send one song a week home and there is a practice record on the back of the music for parents to initial. If this sounds confusing I can forward a pic of my Don't Brea the Chain incentive board that I display in class.

00:33:56	Storing recorders, I use a shoe door hanger. I use command strips with hooks to hold it to the wall. Each child gets a shoe slot and they are numbered with a label maker. Each recorder has a number, too. I use plastic shoe holder for easy sanitation. Got 'em at Target

00:35:08	I will be storing the kids' recorders in magazine holders but I will insist on them staying in their bag at the end of class. If they don't have a bag, I will provide a ziplock bag for them to store it in.
00:36:14	I have a class set and they store them in the pouch and then I keep them in a bin
00:37:11	Kids are responsible for their own recorder. Each recorder (I purchase mine from
	Musicplay) has its own case. Names on case and initials on recorder with thin sharpee
00:38:09	Yes, what if kids don't have the funds for a school recorder and want to buy one
	from Walmart or Dollar Tree (which have very different tuning from a Yamaha one, for instance)?
00:38:39	I'll give them one before they come in with a toy recorder.
00:39:21	So would it be a good idea to buy some extras for them to use and then they use it until the end of the year?
00:39:48	I do the same. Students have their own recorders, which they bring home. Years ago the teacher before me let kids keep them in school. Meant that many did not practice and if theirs went missing, it was my fault! Write name with sharpies.
	Do not encourage dollar store recorders. We have a fund where parents have donated to help a student in need. The student in need gets theirs like any other student so there is no stigma.
00:40:01	that's what I do. I also ask my kids when they leave the school to donate their recorders to my classroom
00:40:10	If I have a kid who wants to buy their own recorder, I send home a couple of links of where to buy them, or give them the name of a local music store.
