

Finding the Singing Voice & Using Solfa in Individual Lessons

The more fun action songs and singing games that children sing in unison the more comfortable they will be using their voices. I include action songs within lessons and choir rehearsals to help encourage students to sing together.







Each song comes with teaching ideas, teaching notes, videos of the songs being modelled with 'real children', accompaniments, lyrics, lyrics with generalist teachers and experienced music



Development:

Create new verses in groups
following the same structure and
rhyming pattern, let the group

Finding the Singing Voice Webinar Objectives

To share ways of encouraging students to find their singing voice

To explore and improve pitch both in the classroom and with individual singers

To use Kodaly influenced musicianship particularly with pitch based activities



Learning using Kodaly Methodology

'The educational work of Zoltán Kodály was driven by his belief that "music belongs to everybody". His ideas evolved into a philosophy of music education based on the way that children learn most naturally: through singing games, fun and play as part of a sequential and progressive approach to teaching music.' BKA website

Kodaly methodology utilizes three main steps: preparation, presentation, and practice

Preparation - learning to sing the songs & play the singing games, subconsciously learning the songs and material which are the teaching tools.

Presentation - using the song as the tool to learn about the pulse, rhythm, phrase or pitch within the song

Practice - exploring & developing musical concepts through the song eg. changing the pitch, dynamic or tempo, singing in canon, adding an ostinato



Finding the Singing Voice



Zoltan Kodaly said,

"Teach music and singing at school in such a way that it is not a torture but a joy for the pupil. Instill a thirst for finer music in them, a thirst which will last for a lifetime."

Michael Stocks of the Voices Foundation said,

"A child with an undiscovered voice is a deprived child, restricted in his or her music making and destined to feel musically demoralised."

Watching the videos of children modeling action songs encourages more confident unison singing.

If you have a song with actions that you feel are a bit 'young' or 'not cool enough' for the age of the group create more complex actions or rhythmic hand clapping patterns so the children still have fun while getting to know the melody. This will help with vocal confidence & working with solfa later.



Finding the Singing Voice

So how can we transform an under confident singer who has not yet found their singing voice help them become a more confident, tuneful singer?

I have found there are several stages between a child's awareness of their voice, their

singing voice and being able to sing accurately at pitch.

Identify and explore what pitch actually means by exploring vocal timbre

Identify what a singing voice is

Achieve a good overall class/group unison singing sound

Achieve a good unison 'at pitch' singing sound from the whole class

Achieve a good unison 'at pitch' singing sound from half the class

Achieve a good unison 'at pitch' singing sound from a smaller group

Work to achieve a good unison 'at pitch' individual singing sound

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
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Autumn Leaves - teaching pitch direction








