Learning Objectives:

Materials:

 Teachers should have access to a ukulele the evening of the class if possible to participate and play along.

Why Teach Ukulele?

• Develops fine motor skills

- It is beginner friendly for grades 3 and up
- You can introduce many different genres to music with this instrument
- Students can do this alone or with others

- PTO
- Budget on a yearly basis

Brands and Styles of Ukuleles

- 4 sizes of ukuleles
 - Soprano, concert, tenor, and baritone
 - I recommend a soprano for beginners- economical and great for working on hand/eye coordination
- Best Economical Brands:
 - Diamond Head, Kala, Lanikai, Luna (just a few examples)
 - Price range is around \$40-75, with a vinyl case. I try to shop local and support our local music shops and it gets families familiar with music companies in the area.

Basic Fundamentals

- History of the instrument- Hawaii- show on map
- Treating instrument with respect
- How to handle it, sitting elbow length apart, case under chair
- Demonstrate mirror your fingers and chords for the students
- Direction of instrument (I teach ALL right handed), wiggling fingers, hugging instrument

First Lesson

- Musicplay Chord Chard- print out chords for students to reference in the classroom
- Put the C7 chord on the smartboard
- Have students repeat what you say when creating a C7 chord
- Discuss the 4 strumming patterns (4 quarter notes, quarter note eighth notes, all eighth notes)
- Take chord hand off and on several times for practice
- Whole process should take 15 minutes- try not to overwhelm students with too many chords
- SMILE when playing C7 Chord- Easy Ukulele- Coconut on musicplayonline

2nd Lesson

- Review handing of instrument, chord chart, fingers, direction of ukulele, ect.
- Review the C7 chord and play through Coconut on musicplayonline
- Many great songs to choose from on musicplayonline,
 - Jambalya
 - Ukualiens (youtube)
 - Easy Ukulele online

Assessment:

- I have a ukulele unit that runs for 5-6 lessons consistently, so prepare around concerts, ect.
- Students are assessed on three chords
- Students come to my desk one at a time and demonstrate proper hand/eye coordination playing the C, C7 and G chord
- Ukulele letter with all the details for purchasing a ukulele for any students that masters the three chords. (this is the clear expectation on after the 1st lesson- so students do not go home and purchase one right away)
