Teaching Outdoor Music Classes

Benefits of teaching music outside:


- Safer outside than indoors
- May be allowed to sing, play recorders
- More room for movement
- Bucket Drums, recorders will be quieter outside than in a classroom
- Opportunity to get out of the classroom

Difficulties teaching music outside:

- Have to haul all your stuff
- No power
- No projector
- No white board/chalkboard
- Outdoor noise, people, will interfere
- Rain, snow, heat

Full Time Outside? Or just part time?

- Full time outside may not be practical for many teachers, but taking classes outside for part of a class will give you some of the benefits!
- Easier to do movement with 6' space
- Turn chase games into "race" games no touching, but still have the fun!
- Gives the air in your classroom (if you're in a classroom) time to exchange.
- Gives kids a break and some fresh air!



Don't have natural shade?

Set up an open air tent.

#1 - Find a space with wifi, shade, cover

Location, Location

Even if you can't project, wifi is helpful. Stay close enough to the school that you get good wifi.

It's still really hot in some places – find shade!

There will be rainy days, so if you can get an open air tent, that will give you protection

Access to sidewalks so you play with chalk

#3 - Packing your Stuff

- Music stand and clips or clothes pegs. Tape.
- 11x17 paper for writing on, chart paper, white board, chalkboard, or nearby sidewalk and chalk
- Ukuelele and recorder are small and nice to have
- Any instruments you want kids to play that they don't have assigned to them.

#3 - Packing your Stuff

Sam Burton says: Students sit on buckets, and I sanitize them between classes. The orange bucket is for supplies that have been used and need to be cleaned. There is also an extension cord and my sanitizer spray in the front wagon.

The back cart holds my drawer with clean instruments, crate with my lesson plans, my personal instruments (slide whistle, tone block and mallet, soprano glockenspiel), pencils, water cup, etc. Back is my speaker, ready to plug in.

I wear a waitress apron with my phone, keys, bluetooth transmitter and receiver, and audio jack.

The two carts are bungeed together and everything on the back cart is bungeed in place. **Sam Burton**

#2 - Seating for Kids

- · Towels, logs, buckets, crates
- Bucket drumming buckets
- One school bought a milk crate for every child.
 They put music supplies in the crate and cary them to the outdoor space for music class, then sit on the crates
 - Spray paint spots on the grass if allowed.
 - Bring a comfy lawn chair for you!

#3 - Packing your Stuff

- BRING your CELLPHONE! Put office, principal on favorites.
- Water but remember how far you are from bathrooms!

 kids love the chase games: Lucy Locket, Mouse Mousie, Charlie Over the Ocean, Tisket a Tasket, Madame I Have, Cut the Cake, Ickle Ockle, Hill Hill, I'm the Fastest Turkey, Our Old Sow, Kings Land, Frog in the Middle, Built my Lady, Let us Chase the Squirrel, John the Rabbit,



#Hill Hill Adaptation

Line 6-8 kids (spaced) and have a race!

Then the next 6-8, then the last group.

Sing the song if allowed outside. If not, play the recording, then say go! Kids race to the finish.

Do they care who won? Usually not!

- Notate on 11x17 paper or with chalk on sidewalk

Drumming

Hard to haul out but drum circles outside are awesome!

A teacher sent us a video of her using the Rhythm Playalongs in the Read, Clap, Play section of Musicplayonline with her drummers - she played the blue slide, kids echoed on the green.

If you have wifi, you can read screen and model - and kids echo

Boomwhackers

Can't project, so can't use to read, but can do activities with them.

- Copy what I do
- Improvise, class echoes, student 1, class, student 2, class etc
- **Improvise** to practice names of lines and spaces. Call out – Line 1 E $\downarrow I$ $\downarrow I$, all those with an E improvise. Space 2-A. Try 4 beats, then 8.

Boomwhackers

Layer rhythms, create rhythms with words, found objects, or notes

Layer 1: Carrot carrot broccoli peas

Layer 2: Vegetables are good for you.

Use CDE GA C' pentatonic so sounds aren't hugely discordant


Boomwhackers

Poison Rhythm – you lead

- Play a pattern
- kids echo except for the poison pattern
- If you need ideas, use Poison Rhythm on the website.

If Allowed - Recorders

Recorder composition is far more successful outside than in a classroom!



Scavenger Hunt

Send kids around school yard to find green leaf, brown leaf, 4 blades of grass, 2 pebbles, a pine cone, or whatever you have in your yard.

Create rhythms with your found objects.

Sidewalk Chalk

Rhythm hopscotch - 8 chunks, ta or ti-ti Rhythm composition, create, play Staff lesson Melody writing

Rhythm Hopscotch

Notate songs - eg. Hill Hill

Teacher write and students read Teacher derives rhythm with student input

Rhythm dictation

Create rhythms, find way to perform them Use tracks in Bucket Drumming Gr. 6 to accompany<mark>.</mark>

This is what I have. You have to order the mike separately. With amplifier and mike it's about \$280 but well worth it. Before this was recommended, I had used cheaper products, and there's no comparison. You will be shocked at how much less tired you are when using it. Until I went to a doctor of vocal therapy, I lost my voice multiple times in the year despite all types of exercises and correct vocal technique, my voice just got fatigued.
