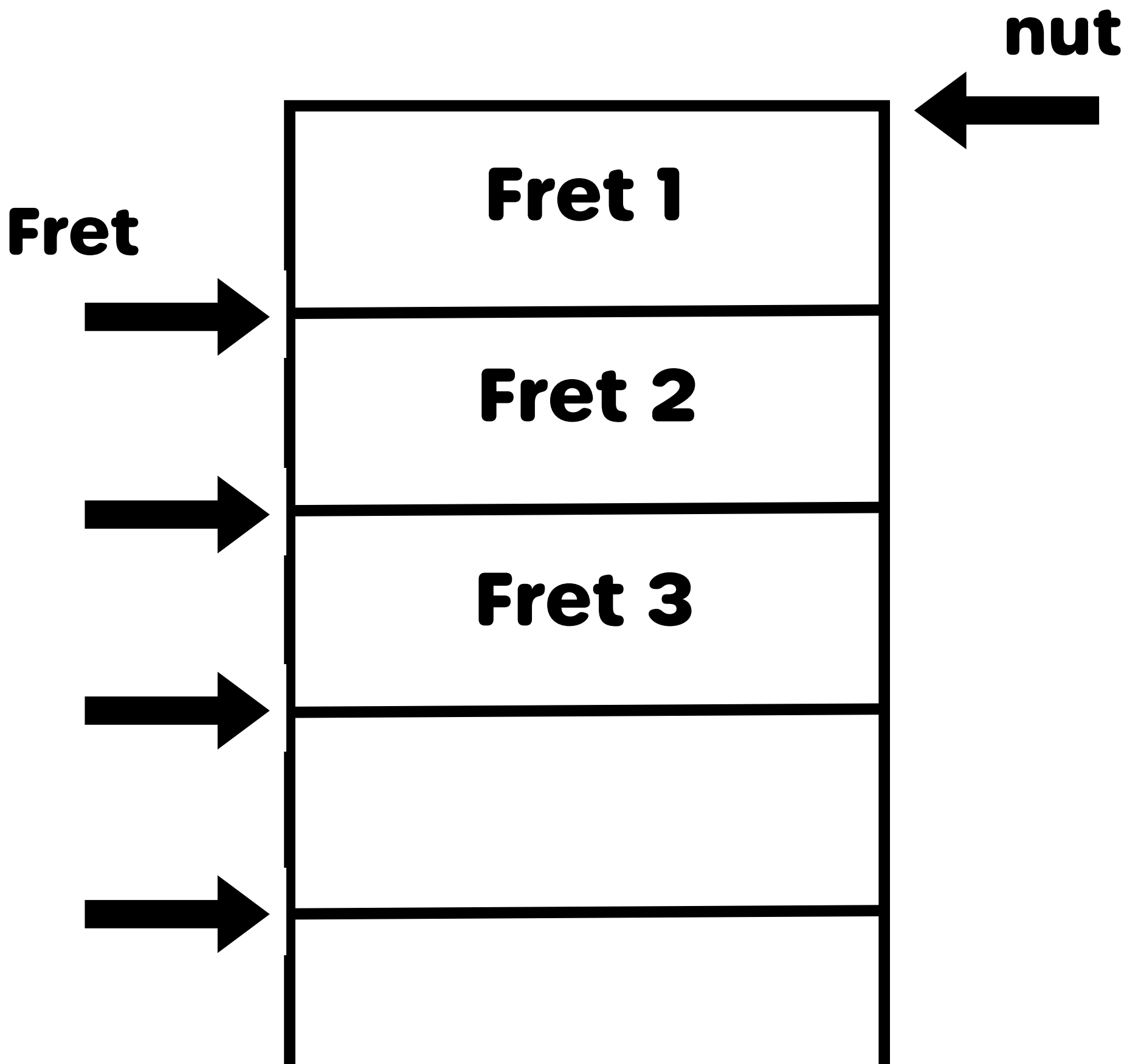


Chord Charts

Frets



The fret is the piece of metal that lays across the fretboard.

But when I say "Fret 1," you put your fingers in the space between the fret and the nut.
